Canine Ovariohysterectomy

Local block with 3.3 mls Bupivacaine, 0.8 mls Lidocaine, 0.1 mls Buprenorphine 0.6mg/ml. Gave ~1/3 as line block at incision site, then ~1/3 as splash on each ovary intra-op (applied by asst)

Surgery

Clipped and prepped ventral abdomen. Made ventral midline incision of approximately 3 cm. Exteriorized right ovary and placed 2 encircling sutures of 2-0 polydioxanone, transected, no bleeding seen.

Repeated on left.

Placed 2 encircling sutures of 2-0 polydioxanone monofilament around uterine body, transected, no bleeding seen. Did final check of both pedicles and stump, no bleeding seen.

Closed linea with 2 cruciates of 2-0 polydioxanone monofilament.

Closed subcutaneous layer in a simple continuous pattern using 2-0 polydioxanone monofilament.



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Closed subcuticular with 2-0 polydioxanone monofilament.  
Applied tissue glue to skin.  
Made 3 cm skin incision paramedian and applied green tattoo ink, closed with glue.

Call if any Bleeding persists. Please keep quiet and confined for 7-10 days.

Please store medication away from heat and direct sunlight, complete all medication unless otherwise directed.

Please have Willow wear an E-Collar if she is caught licking or whenever she is unattended.

Willow may be tired and a little whiny tonight from anesthesia. This will wear off over the next 12 hours. She may also have a decreased appetite for the next day or so, but offer her a small amount of food tonight.

You can start Willow's medication tonight if she is eating. If she does not eat, please start her medication in the morning.

Please let us know if Willow is not eating by Thursday.

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## **Post-Operative Spay Instructions**

Willow has been spayed today, which involved surgery in a very sensitive area and therefore she needs care for some time after the event. Unfortunately, dogs do not always understand that they must rest so we need you to assist in Willow's recovery.

When you pick Willow up from our hospital, she may be a little drowsy. This is quite normal following an anesthetic and surgery. The drowsiness should subside over the next 12 - 24 hours. Please keep her inside and warm tonight. There may be some bruising, just as in humans, so Willow should not be expected to be completely normal for a few days.

Please keep Willow quiet and rested during this time including no running, jumping, or vigorous activity. Willow's incision will need to be kept dry, that means no bathing, swimming, etc. It is very important that Willow does not lick her incision as this can introduce infection and also open the wound. Please monitor the incision for any signs of redness, swelling or discharge; and if any of these are identified please contact us.

Please offer Willow only small amounts of food and water tonight. From tomorrow morning, she can receive food and water as normal.

Generally, there are very few complications following this operation, however, there are some signs to watch out for that may indicate a problem. If you notice any of these signs please contact us immediately:

- Dull and listless especially (especially after the first 24 hours)
- Excessive redness or irritation around the suture line
- Swelling or lumpiness around the suture
- Discharge from the wound or reproductive organs
- Vomiting, diarrhea, inappetence or blood in the stool
- Chewing at incision
- Thick discharge or odor from the wound
- Urinary incontinence (leaking of urine)
- No stools for more than 2 days after coming home
